Pelcome to word-share's Full Lessons Page. Each lesson focuses on one doctrine. Full means that the content of each lesson is detailed enough to give a basic understanding of its doctrine.

Some doctrines are more complex than others. These often require more than one lesson to ensure clarity. In this scenario, the lesson numbers include the letters A, B, etc. to join them and to show the need to study them in order.

Things you don't understand are complicated; things you understand are simple. This means that most new things are complex until you learn all there is to know about them.

The word "lesson" means "something to be learned." You can learn a little about anything by reading or hearing about it. But, for most of us, the only way to understand a lesson is to study what it is and what makes it tick. Therefore, no lesson should be read or heard, but should be studied until that which was complex is simple.

Today's technology makes the study of any subject easy, fast, and accessible to many people. For example, the software used for this website is "WordPress." It allows you to adjust

these lessons to fit any screen, large or small. They will display on your 65" TV or on your 6.5" iPhone.

However, even though these 2-column lessons are readable on your iPhone, charts and drawings make IPhones undesirable displays. Besides, some of us learn better when reading on paper. So then, you may need to ask a friend to print these lessons if you don't have a printer.

Now, you only need to count the many church denominations to realize the difficulty of writing lessons that every reader can follow. For this reason, I edit some lessons more than once after their first postings. This enables me to make some lessons clearer than before.

To help you know when I repost a lesson, I show the dates of the first and last postings: FPD is First Post Date; LPD is Last Post Date. I include the LPD on each TOC [Table of Contents] to make it easy for you to review the lesson dates. All you need to do is make and keep a print-out of each TOC.
